Raise your hand or stand, as directed by the Chairman, to be recognized, and then state your name and what you would like to say.

Address all remarks and all questions to the Chairman.

Remarks must be relevant to items listed on the agenda.

Speak to the issue, not to the person, and do not question motives or speak ill of another.

Profanity is out of order. Listen attentively, do not whisper in the seats, and do not interrupt a speaker.

Take conversation outside, and mute all but emergency workers' cell phones.

The Kingfield Board of Selectman reserve the right to enter Executive Session pursuant to any of the following 1 M.R.S.A. 405(6) A, B, C, D, E, F G, H. The motion will be identified with both subject matter and the statue that authorizes it to be discussed.
