

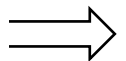

Public Comment: Refer to brochure for detailed information.

Although Board meetings are not public forums, the Board will provide appropriate opportunities for citizens to express opinions and concerns related to the matters under consideration by the Board. The intent is to allow a fair and adequate opportunity for the public to be heard and to provide adequate time for the Board to obtain information and opinions on subjects before it, while ensuring that the time allowed for public discussion does not interfere with the fulfillment of the scheduled agenda.

The Chair may at his/her discretion invite the public to speak prior to the Board's vote on a specific agenda.

The board will not be compelled to respond to comments or answer questions immediately. The board will however take matters into consideration. The Board will use a public comment period simply as a forum to hear from constituents.

Want to be listed on the agenda? The Town Manager, in consultation with the Chairperson will have broad discretion in establishing the Board's official meeting agenda. Members who wish to introduce an item not anticipated to be on the agenda must make a request to the Town Manager by the close of business on the Thursday preceding a Monday meeting.

We ask that you follow our Citizens Participation in Kingfield Board Meetings:

Raise your hand or stand, as directed by the Chairman, to be recognized, and then state your name and what you would like to say.

Address all remarks and all questions to the Chairman.

Remarks must be relevant to items listed on the agenda.

Speak to the issue, not to the person, and do not question motives or speak ill of another.

Profanity is out of order. Listen attentively, do not whisper in the seats, and do not interrupt a speaker. Take conversation outside, and mute all but emergency workers' cell phones.
